

ORDINANCE NO. 18-006

An Ordinance Establishing Prevailing Wage Rates for the Harvard Fire Protection District

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended (820 ILCS 130/1 *et seq.*); and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the President and Board of Trustees of the Harvard Fire Protection District investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said District employed in performing construction of public works, for said District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Harvard Fire Protection District, McHenry County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Harvard Fire Protection District is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the McHenry County area as determined by the Illinois Department of Labor to be in effect as of September 1, 2017 which determination can be found at <https://www.illinois.gov/idol/Laws-Rules/CONMED/Pages/2017-Rates.aspx> and is incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in the aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Harvard Fire Protection District to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Secretary shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Harvard Fire Protection District this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rates of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The Secretary shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Secretary shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Illinois Department of Labor in Springfield.

SECTION 6: The Secretary shall cause to be posted on the District's website the notice of passage of this Ordinance, with a hyperlink to the prevailing wage schedule published on the official website of the Department of Labor, and such posting shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

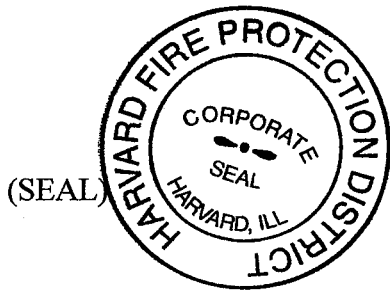

AN ACT concerning employment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Prevailing Wage Act is amended by changing
Section 9 as follows:

(820 ILCS 130/9) (from Ch. 48, par. 39s-9)

Sec. 9. To effectuate the purpose and policy of this Act each public body shall, during the month of June of each calendar year, investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in this Act and publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of such public body its determination of such prevailing rate of wage and shall promptly file, no later than July 15 of each year, a certified copy thereof in the office of the Illinois Department of Labor.

The Department of Labor shall during the month of June of each calendar year, investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages for each county in the State. If a public body does not investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages during the month of June as required by the previous paragraph, then the prevailing rate of wages for that public body shall be the rate as determined by the Department under this paragraph for the county in which such public body is located.

Where the Department of Labor ascertains the prevailing rate of wages, it is the duty of the Department of Labor within 30 days after receiving a notice from the public body authorizing the proposed work, to conduct an investigation to ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in this Act and such investigation shall be conducted in the locality in which the work is to be performed. The Department of Labor shall send a certified copy of its findings to the public body authorizing the work and keep a record of its findings available for inspection by any interested party in the office of the Department of Labor at Springfield.

The public body except for the Department of Transportation with respect to highway contracts shall within 30 days after filing with the Department of Labor, or the Department of Labor shall within 30 days after filing with such public body, publish in a newspaper of general circulation within the area that the determination is effective, a notice of its determination and shall promptly mail a copy of its determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates. If the Department of Labor ascertains the prevailing rate of wages for a public body, the public body may satisfy the newspaper publication requirement in this paragraph by posting on the public body's website a notice of its determination with a hyperlink to the prevailing wage schedule for that locality that is published on the official website of the Department of Labor.
